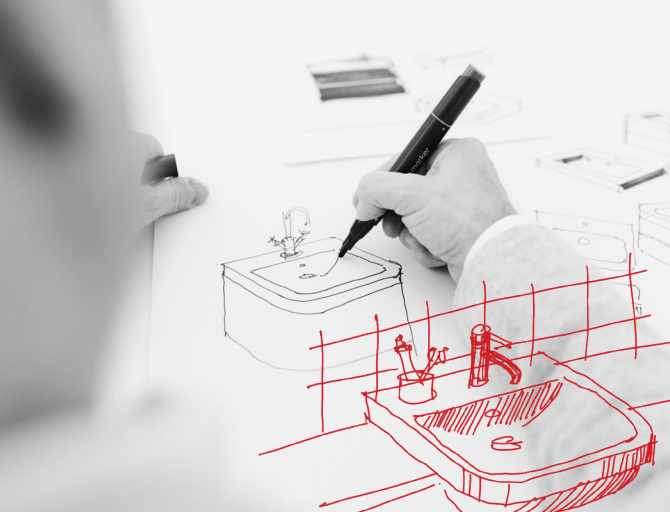




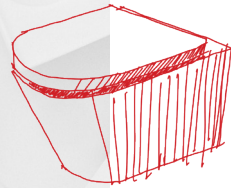

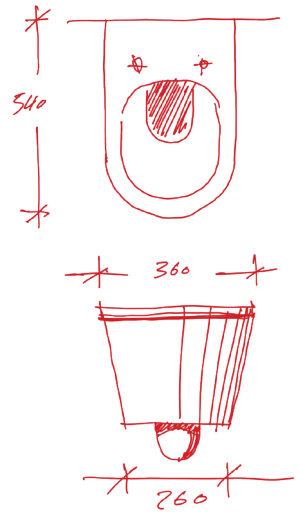
DESIGN IDEA

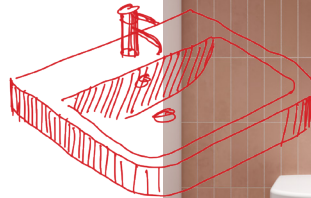
The collection is characterised by distinctive ceramic elements and a coordinated range of furniture finishes.

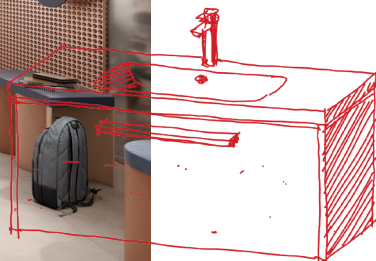




EVOLUTION

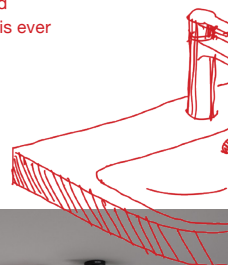




PRODUCT RANGE

D-Code offers a broad selection of washstands, as well as tall and mirrored cabinets, with LED lighting. The modular dimensions and defined material selection ensure that D-Code is easy to plan and perfect for long-term use in hotels, public spaces and residential buildings.

Alongside washbasins with striking front corners, all ceramic elements have been further developed in terms of their form. Furniture – of secondary importance in those days – is now a fixed component in the range; after all, storage is ever more important in the bathroom.
